## Accessible: Education

### Accommodations

The Office of Accessibility collaborates with students to identify reasonable academic accommodations, based on the functional limitations of the student's documented disability. Accommodations are designed to remove educational and environmental barriers that prevent equitable access to the classroom and learning experience. Our disability specialists and students work together to develop an individualized accommodation plan that students can submit to instructors each semester.

### Interpreting

The Office of Accessibility provides interpreting services for deaf/hard-of-hearing students registered with the office, as well as for visitors to campus who need the service. Sign language interpreting services are available for all academic classes, meetings and university-related activities.

### Proctoring


The Office of Accessibility offers comprehensive proctoring services to serve both students and instructors in facilitating exam accommodations. Each semester, our office proctors approximately 1,200 exams, utilizing an online system for exam responses and scheduling.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Approximately 1,150 students a year receive accommodations through the Office of Accessibility.

## Accessible: Campus

### jAUNT

Founded in 2011, jAUNT is a door-to-door, on-campus, transportation service designed to help students, faculty, staff, and visitors easily navigate the campus between classes and meetings. Riders can schedule with jAUNT via email with 24-hour notice at [jAUNT@auburn.edu](mailto:jAUNT@auburn.edu).

### Physical Accessibility

To improve physical accessibility on campus, the director of the Office of Accessibility serves on the ADA Structural Modification Committee. As Auburn continues to update and modernize its campus, the committee ensures that the principles of universal design and physical accessibility are incorporated in future plans for campus improvement. The committee also evaluates current facilities to ensure physical accessibility and make recommendations for improvements.

### Web Accessibility

The Office of Accessibility recognizes that a modern education today extends far beyond the physical borders of the university campus; therefore, our office, under the leadership of the Office of Communications and Marketing and in collaboration with the Office of Information Technology, has joined the Technology Accessibility Group. This group works to ensure that equal and equitable access to information and technology is available to students, employees, and visitors. The group develops standards and guidelines for web accessibility, campus-wide technology, and information dissemination. The goal is to address barriers in the digital environment to promote enhanced usability that benefits all.

### DID YOU KNOW?

All Tiger Transit buses are wheelchair accessible, and an accessible shuttle is available Monday through Friday that runs from the stadium parking deck to Haley Center.
